Stathis Livathinos is former Director of the Greek National Theatre in Athens and previously he served as Artistic Director of the Experimental Stage of the Greek National Theatre. During his tenure he forsters a group of young award-winning actors.

Stathis' work has been invited to stages worldwide, including
Stadsschouwburg Amsterdam, Centro Dramático Nacional (Madrid),
Festival de Teatro Clásico de Mérida, CINARS Biennale in Montreal,
National Theater of China (Beijing), Santiago a Mil Festival (Chile), and Mupa
Budapest.
